Street crews are working on excavation of Lexington Avenue N and installation of drain tile on either side. These crews will continue with placement of fabric, sand, and aggregate as they restore the street section. They will continue their work north of 1st Street NE when utility crews are finished.

Concrete crews will return today to construct sidewalk and driveways on 1st Street SE along with some other miscellaneous areas throughout the project.

Utility crews have completed installation of sanitary sewer main, water main, and storm sewers on Lexington Avenue N. They will start replacement of water and sewer services and will likely complete that work around the middle of next week.

Work on 6th Street NE has started. This initial work included reclamation of the pavement surface. A temporary water main has been placed on both sides of the street ahead of construction to provide service to homes. This pipe will be placed in the boulevard and over driveways, with gravel to allow use before more extensive work on the street occurs. Reconstruction of the sanitary sewer main will likely start the end of next week, requiring full closure of the street.

This is the time to remind everyone that anything within the public right-of-way could be in jeopardy of being damaged and/or removed. This includes landscaping, irrigation or pet containment systems, etc. Those systems are considered "private" facilities. Locating them and marking them in and near the right-of-way is the property owner's responsibility. **There is a high likelihood that items within the right of way, including irrigation and landscaping, will be damaged or otherwise affected by construction activities. Repairs to these items are the responsibility of the property owner.**
