Street crews are working on drain tile and the installation of fabric, sand, and aggregate on Lexington Avenue N between 1st Street NE and 2nd Street NE. They hope to be complete today and have the road temporarily open to residents with a gravel surface for the weekend. They are also planning to excavate and prepare for sidewalk on 2nd Street NE and Lexington Avenue N. This will include removal and preparation of driveways that must be replaced to accommodate the new sidewalk. Concrete crews are expected to return next week to construct curb and gutter on Lexington Avenue N and sidewalk on Lexington Avenue N, 2nd Street NE, and 1st Street SE.

Utility crews will continue working on sanitary sewer this week. They hope to complete replacement of sanitary sewer main and water main by the end of next week and work on services the following week. This work includes replacement of deep sanitary sewer main and will disturb most of the street section. As they complete the connection at Pershing Avenue N, the intersection will be closed for multiple days.

This is the time to remind everyone that anything within the public right-of-way could be in jeopardy of being damaged and/or removed. This includes landscaping, irrigation or pet containment systems, etc. Those systems are considered "private" facilities. Locating them and marking them in and near the right-of-way is the property owner's responsibility. **There is a high likelihood that items within the right of way, including irrigation and landscaping, will be damaged or otherwise affected by construction activities. Repairs to these items are the responsibility of the property owner.**
